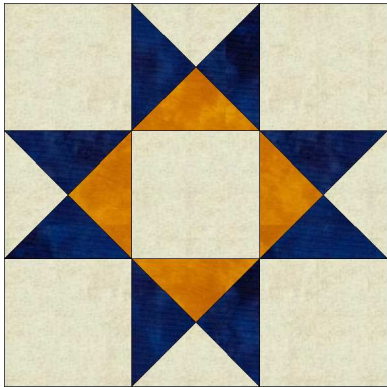


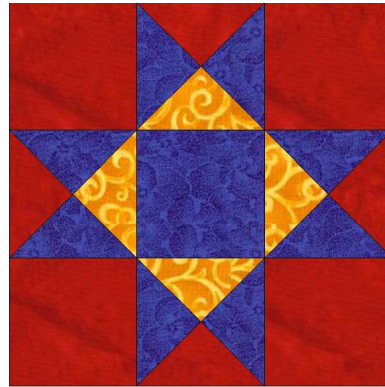

Indianapolis Colts – Ohio Star Block



Indianapolis Colts Block



Freedom Stars – Ohio Star Block

Finished Size 12" x 12"

You will need to cut:

From Background Fabric A (white tone on tone) - five $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

And one 5.25 " x 5.25 " square re-cut across both diagonals to yield four (white) quarter-square triangles.

From Star Points Fabric B (Blue) – two 5.25 " x 5.25 " squares re-cut across both diagonals to yield eight (blue) quarter-square triangles.

From Accent Fabric C (gold) – one 5.25 " x 5.25 " square re-cut across both diagonals to yield four (gold) quarter-square triangles.



Sew together one Fabric A (white) and one Fabric B (blue) quarter-square triangle to make first half of unit A and one Fabric C (gold) and one Fabric B (blue) quarter-square triangle for second half of unit A. Be sure to orient fabrics as in diagram on the left.

Being careful to match points and orient fabrics correctly, sew together first half and second half of unit A to get completed quarter-square triangle unit A. Repeat three more times to yield four unit A's.

UNIT A

Using diagram at top of page for color placement, combine the four quarter-square triangle unit A's with the five background Fabric A (white) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew units together as you would for a basic nine-patch block to make finished star block.

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
